It is a joy working to creatively design worship that offers people the opportunity to praise, experience and encounter God.

UALC is a gift and blessing in my life. I love this church. It is here that God, and His people, grow, challenge, teach and inspire me. I continually see the faithfulness of God through my work in Congregational Care and Worship. I believe He has an exciting future for this congregation, which I'm thrilled to be part of.

## *God's Hygiene Help Center*

Have you seen Diane and Tammy around church? Some people think they are sisters, but they are really two good friends doing God's work through God's Hygiene Help Center. Six years ago, Tammy Jewell saw a need for hygiene and cleaning items for those in need. The food pantries and shelters were supplying many needed items, but Tammy soon realized that there was no resource for dignity items. She had always helped people, but how much help could she provide on her disability check? God told her, "You start a help center. I will provide."

Every month Tammy helps about 140 people who come to her door for hygiene and cleaning items. Those needing help include a number of refugees. After attending the Bridges class and the recent "Without Borders" conference at UALC, Diane and Tammy have distributed copies of the Injeel (the New Testament in Arabic-English) along with other items. Diane

explained, "As ambassadors for Jesus, our goal is to construct a bridge by which our friends can cross over from misunderstanding to truth, from fear to faith. Set goals for how many copies of the Injeel you want to gift to your new Muslim friends. Be intentional about engaging with Muslims."
