

QUESTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION AND PERSONAL REFLECTION:

1. Jesus, already knowing the answer, asks his disciples if they've caught any fish (John 21:5). Why does he ask? - Is there anything like this in your life, something that should be going better than it is? What might Jesus ask you about? Why does Jesus need to put his finger on these failures?

2. We are told that Jesus already has fish on the fire for breakfast. But he still asks Peter to bring some fish (John 21:9-10). What do you think this means?

3. Even at the end of Jesus' earthly life, he's still the hero and main actor in the story. Rather than a story of Jesus now handing off his work and legacy to his followers to carry on, it's a story of how he continues to save them and work in and through them. What's the difference between doing things for Jesus and doing things with Jesus?
